

## Science Fair Booth Exhibits

### Forensic Science Demystified

In this activity students will create Science Fair Booth Exhibits to teach each other about Forensic Science.

It is recommended that you show your class the RCMP PowerPoint presentation first.

Divide your class into six groups. Assign each group one of the following topics:

- Forensic Biology
- Forensic Pathology
- Forensic Entomology
- Forensic Chemistry/Toxicology
- Forensic Counterfeits and Documents
- Forensic Firearms Identification or Ballistics

Give each group a copy of their section from the ***Introduction to Forensic Science Handout***.

Ask students to work together to create a Science Fair Booth Exhibit to teach each other about their topic. They can use props, charts, photographs and graphics to make their presentation better. They can also use the Internet to gather more information if they wish.

Ask them to ensure the material is Canadian.

## Jeopardy Game

### Forensic Science Demystified

Have your students create questions for a Jeopardy game and then play it in class.

It is recommended that you show the RCMP PowerPoint presentation prior to this activity.

Give each student a copy of the *Introduction to Forensic Science Handout* to read.

Divide your class into six groups. Assign each group one of the following topics:

- Forensic Biology
- Forensic Pathology
- Forensic Entomology
- Forensic Chemistry/Toxicology
- Forensic Counterfeits and Documents
- Forensic Firearms Identification or Ballistics

Ask the students to study their section and create at least 15 questions with answers related to their topic for the Jeopardy game.

Students should word the questions and answers in Jeopardy game format. For example:

Q: This person works in a lab and processes specimens that are brought to him/her by the police. (\$200.00)

A: Who is the Forensic Biologist?

Each question should be assigned a value that is:  
\$200.00, \$400.00, \$600.00, \$800.00, \$1,000.00.

They can use the Internet to gather more information if they wish. Ask them to ensure the material is Canadian.

Bonus marks to be given to any student who records the Jeopardy music to play in class or hums it before answering a question.
